Learn to communicate effectively through use of the English language. Our classes are held mornings, afternoons, and evenings at Lincoln Education Center, our main campus, and mornings at Clinton Corner Family Campus, our satellite location. Classes range from Beginning Literacy through Intermediate High/Advanced and include listening, speaking, reading and writing. Classes are also available in Pronunciation and Citizenship. An ESL Academic class focuses on skills necessary to transition to postsecondary education.

In Beginning High classes and above, students can also prepare to pass the citizenship examination by studying United States history and government. Students interested in preparing for the citizenship interview test can also receive assistance. We also offer English language support classes for computer courses.

In Beginning Low classes and above, students also receive EL Civics instruction. EL Civics curricular units are designed to assist students in understanding and navigating governmental, educational, workplace systems and key institutions such as banking and healthcare.
